Decision regarding Muslim Weddings by Proxy in Greece

The NCHR held extensive discussions on the complex legal and social issues arising from this subject. The NCHR stressed the importance of respect for cultural and religious identities in a pluralist, democratic society. Taking into consideration the relevant principles and rules of international, European and Greek human rights law the NCHR reached the following conclusions:

- (a) Muslim weddings by proxy should be considered by Greek law as "non-existent" with regard to the proxy and the principal's "spouse" and as "null and void" with regard to the principal;
- (b) The principle of legal security dictates that Muslim weddings by proxy already carried out in Greece should be considered as valid;
- (c) The minimum age for the conclusion of a Muslim wedding should be reviewed in the light of article 23 para 3 of ICCPR and of the fundamental constitutional principle of gender equality.
